A. CALL TO ORDER.

Mayor BobbyJo Newell called the regular meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

B. INVOCATION TO BE GIVEN BY PASTOR FLOYD SCOTT OF MISSIONARY BAPTIST CHURCH BRAZORIA AND THE PLEDGE TO THE AMERICAN AND TEXAS FLAGS BY ALL.

Invocation was given by Pastor Floyd Scott of Missionary Baptist Church Brazoria and the pledge to the American & Texas flags was led by Mayor Newell.

C. CONSIDERATION/ACTION TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE FOLLOWING MEETINGS; REGULAR MEETING, JUNE 13, 2017, SPECIAL MEETING & WORKSHOP, JUNE 27, 2017.

Motion was made by Councilman Gary Kersh to approve the minutes of the following meetings; Regular Meeting, June 13, 2017 and Special Meeting & Workshop, June 27, 2017. A second was made by Councilwoman Gail Logsdon. Motion carried unanimously.

D. CITIZENS COMMUNICATION.

John Corder of 313 County Road 912 said it is a disgrace to have the Texas Flag in a corner. He would like to see it with the USA Flag. It is important to know what our rights are and where we come from. Texas has more rights than any other state in the USA.

Andre Blackman of 305 Ave A explained his house floods every time it rains. He said he has talked to them several times. He also said there is an open field right behind his house that is full of weeds. It is taking over my yard and growing up my fence.

E. CONSIDERATION/ACTION TO HEAR AND DECIDE ON REQUEST FROM DAVID HOWARD FOR REMOVING \$6.45 FROM BILL AND REFUND THE OVERPAYMENT FROM THE BEGINNING OF THE EXTRA CHARGE FOR GARBAGE.

Mr. Howard said he formally request the \$6.45 be removed from his bill and a full refund given to him from its inception. Mr. Howard said he is not against the fee just the way it was done. He doesn't think it should be as much as it is. If it was voted on by the people and put on the bill as a separate line according to TML guidelines. He is just against the way it was done.

Councilwoman Gail Logsdon said it just came up as a problem this past year. She has not received any complaints just compliments. Councilwoman Stephanie Cribbs said have heard lots of complaints. They don't mind paying the \$6.45 it is just how it was done. They feel the council has been doing things behind their back. She understands their concerns. The Ordinance that she read states it was to stop and be removed. Councilwoman Gail Logsdon said it has been in effect since 2002 and last year it was capped. It was never the intention to do anything illegally. Mayor Newell said she was asked by a citizen and she has lived in the city for 11 years and didn't know it was there. That was the reason it was brought up. Councilwoman Stephanie Cribbs said another city had this fund as well and then they found out this fund was not legal and they did away with it. The fee itself is a lot of money and we haven't seen anything happen on our drainage system and sewer system of what it was to be used for. It is still not itemized on our bill. Prior Mayor or Council may not even known it was illegal. David Howard asked if this was ever brought in front of the citizens and voted on. City Attorney Charlie Stevenson said this fee is not illegal. TML has not made a formal ruling that it is illegal. It became shady down the road but it was not set up illegally. Citizens don't vote on fees the council does. They do it every year and that is why you elect the council for. Mayor Newell asked if you can normally take off a fee. City Attorney Charlie Stevenson said yes if not related to a utility. Motion was made by Councilwoman Gail Logsdon to take no action on removing \$6.45 from David Howard bill and refunding the overpayment from the beginning of the extra charge for garbage. A second was made by Councilman Gary Kersh. Logsdon, Kersh, Shugart and Parker voted aye. Cribbs voted nay. Motion passed with a 4 - 1 vote.

F. CONSIDERATION/ACTION TO HEAR AND DECIDE ON REQUEST FROM SHANNON SCHNEIDER FOR THE DRAINAGE PROBLEM AT 208 W. ALABAMA AND NEED FOR STOP SIGN OR SPEED BUMPS ON HER DEAD END STREET.

No action taken due to Ms. Schneider not being present.

G. CONSIDERATION/ACTION TO DISCUSS CITIZEN COMMENTS AND INFORMATION PROVIDED BY TML.

Councilwoman Cribbs said we have addressed the wording on agenda. This will take care of the council being able to address the issues that need to be addressed. If you have an issue my phone # is out there. Please call me and we can take care of issues instead of dragging down at council meeting to get things done. City Attorney Stevenson said this was just added to give direction on what the citizen is able to do when talking to the council. It also tells them what kind of response can be given to citizen. Councilwoman Cribbs said no more personal attacks. Councilman Kersh asked what you call personal attacks because it is there opinion. Mayor Newell read what TML has on website.

H. CONSIDERATION/ACTION TO DISCUSS AND TAKE ACTION ON ACCOMMODATING COUNCIL MEMBERS/CITIZENS WITH DISABILITIES.

Councilwoman Cribbs said we have a lot of senior citizens and a lot of people who can't hear on the back row. She proposed the city put in microphones so the citizens can hear us. According to open meetings law you have to have a disclaimer on the agenda that states that if you need reasonable accommodations contact city hall. City Manager Teresa Borders said it is on the bottom of the agenda. Councilwoman Logsdon asked if we get any calls and City Secretary Sheila Williams said no. Councilwoman Cribbs said they are not expensive and when council talks they talk into the microphone. Councilwoman Logsdon asked if this needs to go into the budget. City Manager Borders said yes. City Secretary Sheila Williams asked Councilwoman Cribbs if she could talk louder so the recording could pick her voice up better. Councilwoman Logsdon asked if there was anything else that would help. Councilwoman Cribbs said she felt the microphones would be a good place to start. Councilwoman Logsdon asked the citizens if they can't hear to ask the council to repeat. She said she doesn't mind repeating herself.

I. CONSIDERATION/ACTION TO DISCUSS AND TAKE ACTION ON MONTHLY WORKSHOPS FOR CITIZENS.

Councilwoman Cribbs said she thinks it would be a good way to get citizens involved. It would give them a chance to have a voice and give us feedback and would help in the council voting. They may come up with a better idea of how to do things. There won't be any issues voted on so there doesn't need to be a quorum. City Attorney Stevenson explained Open Meetings Act says if you are going to discuss city business then there needs to be a quorum and it will need to be posted. You will also need a specific item and can't be open ended. Councilwoman Cribbs said she often meets with ports and they have a meeting ahead of time as long as there is no item being voted on. It is stated on the agenda as a non-voting item. City Manager Borders said you can do that as long as the item is listed on agenda. It needs to be posted as if you are going to have a quorum or not. Councilwoman Logsdon said she was looking at the agenda tonight and she didn't know what was going to come up on them because when she looked behind the tabs there was nothing. If you have a workshop and don't know what you are going to discuss will that create a problem. Councilwoman Cribbs said you can call these housekeeping rules to set into motion of

things that have been talked about back & forth. We have heard people complaining and council complaining we have wasted a whole year of not doing anything. That is why I am putting on the agenda. You can't provide supporting documentation on things like the American Disabilities Act. These are things brought up, talked about, discussed and never brought up again. That is why she is putting them on the agenda. That way we can talk about them and do what needs to be done and move forward. Councilwoman Logsdon said she never heard anything before on the ADA and microphones. She knows there was a gentleman that brought a little instrument before that said it helped him but that was a long time ago. Councilwoman Stephanie Cribbs said it has come from the people in the back row and from Ms. Ruby in the wheelchair. Councilwoman Logsdon said it may have been brought up to Councilwoman Cribbs attention but not before council before. Councilwoman Parker said last meeting we were going to institute an action register on issues so we could revisit and mark progress. Maybe we need to make that a standing agenda item so we can take action and show progress month by month. Councilman Kersh said can we have citizens sign up for what they want to discuss and plan a meeting around that. If nobody signs up then we don't need a meeting. City Manager Borders said we will have a list at city hall for people to come sign up for what they want to speak about and then we can make an agenda as needed. It could be at that meeting or at a different time. Councilwoman Cribbs asked how can our citizens comment on an actual agenda item because they can't sit here and say anything right now. Mayor Newell said when a citizen has a concern they need to reach out to a council member or herself. Then it can be put on the agenda. City Manager said they can see the agenda and then if they have a concern talk to a council member and it can be discussed. Councilwoman Logsdon said in previous meeting we asked the citizens if they had any comments on the subject. City Attorney Stevenson said we have been doing that. Councilwoman Cribbs said she would like to open it up to the citizens for their comments and concerns on having a workshop. John Corder of 313 CR 912 said he has experience in workshops. Citizens don't have a right to answer a question but not get an answer. We have some officials that curtail the time of the amount to speak. Texas Open Meetings Act does not describe how many minutes we can have. We used to have 2 minutes here but now have 5. Hope the workshop won't have a time limit so the citizen won't be curtailed by a time limit.

Laura Hall of 234 Pecan wasn't sure what item to speak on because there are new items on agenda that I didn't know about. It is a good idea because we have to sit back and not able to ask questions right now.

Mayor Newell had discussion with County Judge and this city has adopted the Roberts Rules of Order. Some council members have said we would like to get control of the meeting. I need to know if you want to open it up for discussion or have workshops. We can run meetings according to Roberts Rules of Order or make p our own rules. Councilman Kersh said he would personally rather have workshops.

Frank Quinty of 205 Cherry St. said in the past we were able to raise our hands to speak. Mayor Newell suggested he read the open meetings and open records acts. The Citizens Communication part is for citizens to express their concerns. Technically the council meeting is for the council to conduct business in front of the citizens. Frank said he feels they are sitting there like mutes. Mayor Newell said she would invite him to come to the County meetings and see how they are conducted. Frank said Freeport Council meetings people put their hands up and are able to speak.

Felecia Buchanan of 619 Yerby thinks it is a very good idea for workshops. Going to individual members I get a different answer. I would like having a uniformed answer to my questions. Irv Eddy of 304 Ave H said he has been coming to the meetings since 2002 as a citizen or a council member. You can get the agenda and council information on the City of Brazoria Website. City Manager Teresa Borders said if you have a question on the agenda please call myself or Sheila the City Secretary to explain it and why it was put on there. Motion was made by Councilwoman Cribbs to start having monthly workshops for citizens. A second was made by Councilman Kersh. Councilman Kersh said if no one signs up then he doesn't want a monthly workshop. He doesn't want to come up here and just sit with no one here. City Manager said it needs to have when if it is before the council meeting. Councilwoman Cribbs said she works in downtown Houston so getting here by 6:00 will be a little tough. Councilwoman Cribbs amended the motion to have monthly citizen workshops only if we have citizens signed up to speak, we don't have a workshop. Start at 6:00 p.m. the day of regular council meeting. A second was made by Councilwoman Gail Logsdon. Motion carried unanimously.

J. CONSIDERATION/ACTION TO DISCUSS AND TAKE ACTION ON ESTABLISHING CITIZEN WORK GROUPS FOR NOMINATION OF CITY SEWER, DRAINAGE AND ROADWAY ISSUES.

Councilwoman Cribbs said this was talked about at last meeting. Councilman Shugart and Councilman Kersh had already had a list discussed in Garden Acres because they already had most of their issues fixed. I would like a citizen from each side of town to have a chance to nominate or a group of citizens to volunteer. She thinks this is a fair way to have our streets administered throughout the city. Committee then could bring to workshop and council can go from there. Councilwoman Logsdon said she served on a garbage committee before being on council. She knows there is a plan in place and engineer study has to be done with each project. She has found while on council that you fix something in one place and it affects something else on down the road. Mayor Newell said it is good to follow a plan but I have seen people have a problem but not call to tell anybody. Councilwoman Cribbs said she has lived here for 15 years and when she had a problem she called 5 times and each are documented but her name or address has never been on a list. She would like to ask the citizens on their opinion on citizen work groups. Councilman Shugart said there has been lots of money spent and plans on all these areas and citizens don't know where all the outfall ditches are or what these plans are for. On the sewer we have a Public Works Director. That is his job and he knows what needs to be done better than any citizen. Councilwoman Cribbs said it would be beneficial to have on the website where these outfall ditches are what is on the list that is being worked on. Councilwoman Cribbs said she is trying to have an equal balance here for the citizens. Councilman Shugart said the council knows what needs to be worked on. Councilwoman Cribbs said yes for those council members that have been on council for years. Mayor Newell said the citizens come to us and we have to try to find a way of passing it on without telling someone what to do. We can open it up through the committee, we don't have to maintain the committee just listen to them. Councilman Shugart said when he gets a complaint he takes it to the City Manager and she decides what to do unless it's a council item. Councilwoman Logsdon said we hear the complaints every month from Garden Acres, Old Town or Magnolia Gardens is considered informal meeting. She would like to go back

to what Councilwoman Parker said on action items. Councilwoman Parker said she feels David Jordan should be a interval part of that since this is his bread & butter. Councilman Kersh said if David Jordan is chairman of the committee then he can answer the questions before they ever get started. David Jordan said we have a drainage plan but citizens don't like the plan because we no longer dig ponds. We start at the river and we work in so that way when we dig a ditch water has a place to go. If you start a Citizens work group are you going to get away from your drainage plan? Brazoria has 7 outfalls and Brazoria only controls 2. You have drainage commissioners that control the other 5. We have spent over 3 million dollars in the last 10 years on sewer with grant money & in our budget addressing issues. We work closely with our engineers. Every line that is replaced helps another person on that line whether at Junior High or in Garden Acres. We have a map that shows where every line has been replaced. He feels the council better buckle down because he has smoke testing starting. You will have to make citizens fix their lines. City Manager said citizens can bring us what they want but there is more detail to it of when we can do it and where can we do it than just turning in something and wanting to get it done. We don't mind the committees but there may be an issue and we can't fix each problem immediately. Mayor Newell knows there are issues that need to be looked at that is supposed to drain but it is not draining. That is why she doesn't have a problem with someone coming up and telling their problem. Councilwoman Cribbs reminded council what the agenda item is and nowhere did she say that she wanted the citizens to make the decision or what they say is go. What I want for our citizens is to know what is going on in their side of town. She asked David Jordan if he is writing down and keeping lists where our citizens can see it. Not having it written down or an action item list showing where the progress is going is a waste of time. Mayor Newell asked if there are any citizens that want to advocate for or against citizen groups.

Bill Lott of 310 Red Oak says it's a good idea and he would volunteer for that. Peggy Taylor of 229 Yaupon says it is an excellent idea and make the committees from the workshop.

Councilwoman Logsdon asked if she was willing to serve on a committee. Ms. Taylor said yes. Irv Eddy of 304 Ave H says his personal opinion is why we have David Jordan and we have the council that we voted for. That is where it should stop right there. I know more about drainage now than when moved into house. I think you can have input from the committee's but final decision should be David and Council. Councilwoman Parker said perhaps if we had on our website we could have a button where we could enter suggestions and it goes to all council members at once. Motion was made by Councilwoman Logsdon that we establish a Citizen's Work Group for nomination of city sewer, drainage and roadway issues. A second was made by Councilwoman Stephanie Cribbs. Councilwoman Logsdon if we have a group like this can the group meet with a council person. City Manager said it can be a citizen instead of the council member that would present to the city council. David Jordan said without himself or someone from his staff the committee will not go anywhere because they will not know what is going on. City Manager said David Jordan could address it when it comes to council instead of being on the committee. City Attorney Stevenson said to establish the committee you would have to be more thorough by establishing the size of the committee and how it is appointed and where a council member serve as an ex-officio member. He suggested they put together a plan with this information in it and come back to next meeting. Councilwoman Logsdon amended her motion to table establishing citizen work groups for nomination of city sewer, drainage and roadway issues until a plan can be made. Councilwoman Cribbs would like to see an ad put in paper. Mayor

Newell said on website also. A second was made by Councilwoman Cribbs. Logsdon, Cribbs and Parker voted aye. Shugart and Kersh voted nay. Motion passed with 3-2 vote.

K. CONSIDERATION/ACTION TO HEAR ON PROPOSED ORDINANCE FOR BILLBOARDS IN CITY LIMITS.

City Manager explained we only had an ordinance for the electronic signs but we have backed off other than their business for brightness and not obstructing traffic. City Attorney Stevenson said there has been a lot of litigation about the sign ordinances because of free speech. It will need to be narrowly drawn. Councilwoman Cribbs is seeing in the bigger cities that signs are lower now. David Jordan said it is mainly home rule cities because of zoning. City Manager said that is another reason because we are not zoned. Mayor Newell said because we are on Highway 36 there are a lot of signs popping up. We need something since we are a throughway on Highway 36. Councilwoman Cribbs said have we contacted our local district office with TXDOT because if we issue a permit we can control. Chief Longbotham said a group of citizens came in and approached former Mayor Corley about a sign with half naked women and a couple churches got involved. City Manager said we need to get together with other cities and see what they have. Motion was made by Councilwoman Cribbs on proposed ordinance for billboards in city limits we gather information first and then bring back for discussion. A second was made by Councilman Kersh. Councilwoman Parker asked if we could add guidelines for signs in general. Mayor Newell said that would be a part of gathering information. Motion carried unanimously.

L. CONSIDERATION/ACTION TO HEAR ON PROPOSED FOOD TRUCK ORDINANCE FOR OPERATION AND UPKEEP.

Councilwoman Cribbs said she doesn't have problems with the actual food truck. She is concerned that they are neat. There are some in town that are not as neat. Don we have the State food permit posted, are they inspected by us, do they have their health stickers. David Jordan explained the County does all that. We are contracted through the Brazoria County Health Dept. Mayor Newell asked if we have an ordinance on food trucks and Councilman Kersh said we don't have food trucks just food trailers. He explained the difference between food trucks and food trailers. He said if they took their food trailers to Freeport then they would have to purchase a permit because they have their own inspectors. Sweeny makes you go to City Hall and purchase a permit and go to police dept. get a background check & fingerprinted and it is a \$50.00 fee. The only issue I have with it is the appearance. Some are really nice and others are not. He thinks the sign issue would straighten some of that up. I welcome every business that comes to Brazoria because without a tax base we can't do anything. Mayor Newell asked if we have an ordinance for the food trailers. City Manager Borders explained since they are permanently attached to the lot they are not considered temporary. They have to follow all the same rules as a brick & mortar business. Councilwoman Cribbs said on the State Health Dept. website they have all the sample ordinances for municipalities. She asked if all the food trailers have restrooms and David Jordan said yes. She would like to see the city get some revenue. City Manager Borders said we don't allow food trucks at all and we can look at other cities what they have. Councilwoman Parker said a background system would be a great thing to have. City Attorney Stevenson said if we are

requiring them to set up as a permanent business we can't require them to do background checks. Councilman Kersh said if they come in as temporary then we can require a background check. Peddlers Permit is \$10.00 a day or \$100.00 a month. Councilwoman Cribbs said her biggest thing is to see the aesthetics. City Manager Borders said you want to see the aesthetics on the permanent trailers. City Attorney Stevenson said the aesthetics is harder to regulate. Councilwoman Parker said that what we need is consistent policy guidelines for when they come in are given and then they follow and code enforcement follows up. City Manager asked City Attorney Stevenson if something like the Mobile Home Ordinance be done. He said sure. Councilman Kersh said we usually go with the recommendation of Code Enforcement. Councilman Cribbs said if we did follow with the aesthetics then that would help in the fining process. Amber Graves with Corner Stop said she owns their property could we rent our driveway to a food truck and can they work under our health dept. permit? Councilman Kersh said no they would have to get their own permit for their truck but no zoning so they could park there. Public Works Director David Jordan said to let the health dept. do the inspections because we would have to hire our own inspector and they are around \$50,000. Motion was made by Councilwoman Stephanie Cribbs to establish a food trailer ordinance for the aesthetics of the establishment. A second was made by Councilwoman Logsdon. Councilwoman Logsdon asked if the establishments now would be grandfathered. City Manager Borders said yes. Motion carried unanimously.

M. CONSIDERATION/ACTION TO START ENGINEERING ON 3-6 STREETS TO REPAIR SEWER PROBLEMS.

Councilman Shugart said for years we have been hearing the problems over this. He wants to hire an engineer to come in and get started. City Manager said hiring an engineer will have to go into next year's budget. Councilwoman Cribbs asked if the public works has snaked the line to see if nothing has collapsed. Councilman Kersh said it is probably infiltration. David Jordan asked to correct it to Northside Subdivision. Motion was made by Councilman Shugart to take to workshop on hiring engineer for Northside Subdivision sewer problems. A second was made by Councilman Kersh. Motion carried unanimously.

N. CONSIDERATION/ACTION TO HIRE ENGINEERS TO LOOK AT W. AVE A AND PEGGY TAYLOR'S SEWER PROBLEMS.

Councilman Kersh said he would like to see it smoke tested before we hire an engineer. David Jordan said we have to wait till it dries out before we can smoke test. Councilwoman Logsdon asked Peggy Taylor if she understands what that will do when you smoke test. Peggy Taylor said she understood. Motion was made by Councilman Kersh to have David Jordan from Public Works to have Peggy Taylor's sewer line smoke tested. A second was made by Councilwoman Cribbs. Motion carried unanimously. David Jordan said he feels it would be a waste of time to smoke test. He feels it needs engineering. Motion was made by Councilman Kersh to hire engineering at Ave A and smoke test. A second was made by Councilwoman Cribbs. Motion carried unanimously.

O. CONSIDERATION/ACTION TO APPROVE RESOLUTION #17-006 FOR BRAZORIA STORM CLEANUP FUND ACCOUNT.

Motion was made by Councilman Kersh to approve Resolution #17-006 for Brazoria Storm Cleanup Fund Account. A second was made by Councilwoman Logsdon. Motion carried unanimously.

P. CONSIDERATION/ACTION TO ADDRESS ISSUE ON CURBING AT S. BROOKS AND LOUISIANA STREET.

Amber Graves with Corner Stop said it has been resolved. Councilwoman Cribbs said her issue is when this driveway was put in why wasn't it monitored. David Jordan said we do not permit driveways. Amber Graves said they did what they were told when putting in driveway. Councilwoman Cribbs said she doesn't want to see happening to another citizen that happened to them. She also showed a picture of the apron on the city right-of-way. We need to come up with a permit. Amber Graves showed pictures of the driveway before they fixed the driveway. Councilwoman Logsdon said she drives that way to council meeting and home and she has never had a problem. Amber Graves said it was not their place to repair. They put in and had to break off and it was lots of money. Councilwoman Cribbs wants permits in place so we don't have this problem again. She feels we need to build better communication with our state agencies. David Jordan said he doesn't think when it is not a state road and they said they don't regulate city streets why should we ask the state. Amber Graves said they had the driveway for 3 months and nobody complained. We came and asked the city and we fixed part of the road and that didn't fix the problem. We had to spend more money to repair a problem that wasn't our problem. We came to the city for help and didn't get any help. Councilwoman Logsdon thanked Amber and said the store looks great. She appreciate she came to the meeting. She said she heard that someone approached her and represented the city. David Jordan said he initially approached her and explained it was wrong. Mayor Newell said she wants this brought to the workshop. She asked Amber to come to the workshop. Councilwoman Cribbs said she appreciate her working on the sign. She said if there had been a permit in place then this would not have happened.

Q. CITY DEPARTMENT HEADS REPORT.

1. Court Dept. – Judge James explained report in packet. Judge James said Deputy Court Clerk Cheryl Priour will be retiring and that the city has hired Tracy Kennedy to take her place. We had interviewed 13 applicants. We are going to have to watch our warrants since we have new legislation has come out. Judge James invited everyone to come to the reception for Cheryl Priour.
2. Police Dept. – Chief Longbotham explained report in packet.
3. Public Works Dept. – David Jordan explained report in packet. We are shorthanded with one out on health problems and others that need to take vacation. We have more water leaks in small & large lines with 200,000 gallons water pumped underground on one leak. We have growth with 3 homes under construction. We issued permits for a Four Plex apt. complex.

- Councilman Kersh asked about Washington Street and the trucks going down it. New street put in last year and would like to not see it torn up. ACO officer on staff and turned loose on her own now. Code Enforcement side will be started in a week or so. 23 animals picked up since she has been here. Looking for 2 turtles that disappeared after fireworks.
4. Fire Dept. – Chief Stahl said report in packet. Selling raffle tickets for 4 - wheeler
